The pin committee offered its choice for a class pin and after some discussion its report was accepted. The pin selected will cost \$1.50, and is both characteristic and unique. It consists of a dull gold "N" on which the class numerals will be exhibited in relief. The numerals will be polished. Chairman E. A. Wolf states that the committee is ready to take orders immediately.

Following the report of the committees, it was moved and carried that a second Senior "stunt" should be promulgated before the holidays. A committee consisting of Messrs. Schrelber, Moss, and Green was appointed to work it up. It is not known yet whether the "stunt" will follow weather-beaten tracks or not, but it is hoped that something essentially democratic in its nature may be evolved.
