The examinations are intended mainly fot men, altho women will be There are vacancles at conditions. time for at least 100 teachers in the slands at Initial salaries of from $\$ 1,000$ to $\$ 1,200$ per year; with the prospect of a raise after a short service. The work of these American teachers is largely of a supervisory character, and the higher positions are flled as vacancles occur, by the promotion of those who have demonthe the service.
A special plea is belng made by the graduates for this work and every inducement is being offered to secure their prompt appointment where the examinations warrant such a procedure. Any one desiring further information concerning this work should apply at the executive office of the University.
