MR. STEVENS IN RECITAL.

Instructor From School of Music Scores Hit at Convocation.

The appearance of Mr. Robert Stevens in piano recital at Convocation yesterday morning was nothing less than a triumph. University students are so familiar with the piano playing of a highly technical nature which lacks any emotional touch, that it is difficult to enthuse them over even the best of local performers.

This was distinctly not the case yesterday morning, for Mr. Stevens received the enthusiastic approval he richly deserved. Mr. Stevens is a master of technique, but more than this, he is sympathetic in his renditions to a high degree. The gem of his program yesterday morning was an Etude by Gottschalk, altho a March by Hollander deserved high commendation.

A pleasing feature of his program was Mr. Stevens' rendition of a "humorous" selection, which brought down the house. This willingness to break away from the bonds of classicism for the pleasure of an audience which is notoriously fond of light music, as well as his straightforward and unaffected manner while at the piano, won the enthusiastic approval of all his hearers.

It is to be hoped that Mr. Stevens may be persuaded to appear again at Convocation with a "popular request" recital at some time in the near future.
