## UNIVERSITY CONSCIENCE

The People of Wisconsin Think State University Should Serve Its Sup. porters.
The following news item, taken from a Wisconsin educational Journai seems so much in keeping with conditions thruout many of the other Mississippl Valley states that it is republished in full:
"The report of the legislative committee upon the affairs of the University, made pablic last month, is a conservative document touching many administrative and professional details of the work of the institution.
"There is no doubt but that the thoroness of the investigation made by this committee brought discouragement to some individual members of The faculty-men who have given their fength and intellectual powers far more than the sqlate could reasonabiy demand of them. While this one feature is to be regretted, it is only an incident and was necessary on the part of the men directed to investigate the institution by the law-making body of the commonwealth. We believe that the few thus offended will in time coincide with the general belief of the people of the state-that the investigation, on the whole, was a fair and importial one and must result in reforms which will bring the University into closer touch with the people upon whom it is directiy dependent.
"Without going into details one general result for good seems to have been accomplished, and that is the arousing of the consciences of the powers who control the institution to the fact that the University of Wisconsin was created for the people, and must ever be maintained and con-
ducted in their interests. Unlike Chicago, Yale, Harvard, Leland Stanford and other colleges endowed by private individuals, the Madison institution is dependent upon the tax-payers of the state for its support, and this fundamental fact must never be lost sight of in the administration of its affairs.
"That the University conscience has thus been aroused is evidenced by many reforms already instituted Football has been cleansed, the "prom" has been deprived of its expensive teatures, fraternities, are to be regulated, correspondence courses are being established-and we prophesy for the future a peoples University at Madison, which it will never again be necessary for the legis lature to investigate."
