**PUBLIC SPEAKING.**

**New Courses Offered Under Professor Losey.**

The Department of Rhetoric offers the second semester the following courses in Elocution and Public Speaking, all of which are open to students who did not take the corresponding first-semester course:

52. Reading and Speaking. Emphasis on articulation, enunciation, voice, phrasing and gesture. Class-room readings and declamations with criticism. Special attention given to the elimination of speech defects arising from misuse or malformation of the speech organs. Insistence upon progressive and intelligent work in accordance with scientific principles.

Section I, 9 on M., F. and, at the pleasure of the instructor, 9 on W.

Section II, 9 on T., Th. and, at the pleasure of the instructor, 9 on W.

NOTE—The optional hour will be devoted chiefly to private conference and drill by appointment.

Adjunct Professor Losey.  
54. Dramatic Reading and Interpretation—A study of Shakespeare's "Macbeth" and "Julius Caesar." Preliminary exposition of text, characters and situations, followed by oral interpretation by the class. A study of the principles underlying Shakespearean verse, characterization, and dramatic structure. Insistence upon practical application of principles to intelligent, vivid, and artistic reading. 8, M. W. F.

60. Public Speaking—Classroom declamations and original speeches, illustrating the various forms of public address. Insistence upon sincere and unaffected communication of thought and feeling. Careful attention to voice, emphasis, inflection, gesture, and general deportment before an audience. Specially adapted to students who look forward to teaching, preaching, the law, or work in debate. 10, M., F., and, at the pleasure of the instructor, 10 on W.

NOTE—The optional hour will be devoted to conferences and private drill. Adjunct Professor Losey.

**NEW COURSES.**

Announced by Department of Roman History and Literature.

The following courses of general interest will be given next semester by the department of Roman History and Literature:

Course 7—Roman Antiquities; a study of the private life of the Romans. Illustrated lectures. One hour attendance. One hour credit. Professor Barber.

Course 44—For teachers. Lectures on methods of teaching Latin with exercises. One hour attendance. One hour credit. Professor Barber.

Course 48—Roman History. From the time of the Gracchi thru the early empire. Designed especially for teachers of Latin in the secondary schools. Two hours attendance. Two hours credit. Professor Sanford.

Course 16—Cicero: Tusculan Disputations. Collateral reading in other philosophical works of Cicero. Two hours attendance. Two hours credit. Professor Sanford.

Roman Oratory. A general survey. Lectures, readings, and reports. Two hours attendance. Two hours credit. Miss Hunter.

New course in Latin Composition. Syntax and drill in grammar. Two hours attendance. Two hours credit. Miss Hunter.
