hatten, for membership in the conference, Iowa will recommend Ames, and Missouri has already advocated the membership of Washington from that state. Since Nebraska has no smaller institution which she can recommend for membership, owing to the complete monopoly of educational affairs here, the other states would have a majority of votes in any council which rested the regulation of the affairs of the league, and Nebraska would then be in a position similar to that to which Michigan has come lately, and from which she has threatened to extricate herself by withdrawing from the 'Big Nine' entirely. There was to have been a meeting of the Athletic Board last Thursday morning, but after it was learned that the secretary, L. J. Clapp, had left with the basket-ball team the same morning, it was not held. It is possible a delegate would have been sent to the second meeting at Kansas City recently, but it is unlikely Nebraska would have entered the league, until she saw more advantages than those offered at present.
