different in the two countries. "Owing to our widely different academic system, and our deep-seated social contrasts, we have not been able to adjust ourselves, all at once, to the opportunities afforded by the Rhodes bequest. In the future we must appoint with some concrete sense of the actual circumstances as they exist at Oxford, for it would be an absurdity were we to confess that we had not the material.

"And this diagnosis," says the writer "receives strong corroboration from the achievements of Rhodians sent by British colonies. The proportion of colonials to Americans is about three to eight, notwithstanding which the former won nine honors and prizes while the Americans gained only three. From this we are not to infer that colonial brains are better than our own. The colonials are trained, and what is even more important, chosen by men who are fully alive to the kind of type that will take root in the Oxford environment without any loss of time. The officials propose to have their scholars reflect glory upon the colonial universities just as the English scholars do upon their schools. To be brief, and to use a common expression, the colonial universities are 'next.' We are not, and our pressing business is to remedy this defect at once."

The sending of graduates is discouraged by the writer because he says it is not in accordance with the spirit of the bequest. An appeal is also made that we send rich men's sons, who, like their fellow students, will pass through the university, without pretense, purely for its social advantages. "Only, see to it," he adds, "that remittances are regular and generous."
