INTERCLASS BOARD.

On Athletics Meets and Adopts Some New Rules.

The Interclass Athletic Board met Saturday and adopted the following rule and amendment:

Rule—A student who, in any semester, is not satisfactorily carrying at least twelve (12) hours school work, is debarred from representing any class on any athletic team; moreover, a student who fails to pass in twelve (12) hours at the end of a semester is debarred from representing any class in any athletic capacity the semester following.

Amendment—One hour university credit shall equal one hour entrance credit.

This amendment was made to modify the rule requiring Freshmen to have 28 hours entrance credits. Under the rule as amended a Freshman who, upon entrance has only 26 points, may make 14 hours one semester while in school, two of which may be applied to his entrance credits, making the required 28 points and leaving the 12 hours credit necessary for participation in athletic contests.
