
Professor Losey Gives Talk on Play

Professor Losey gave a talk on Shakespeare's "Macbeth" at Convocation yesterday morning, dealing with the conception of the tragedy and com-

Macbeth was a great man bearing the stamp of a defect of "vaulting ambition which o'erleaps the mark." The defect in Hamlet was in itself an excellence; viz., his sensibility. He was a man to believe in the genuine, who felt intensely, and suffered deeply when he said, "All that lives must die, passing through nature to eternity.' But it was under the given conditions that he was hurried on to ruin. The same is true of Lear, Othello and
