ENGINEERING NOTES.

As in previous years, the Westing-
house Electric and Manufacturing
Company, of Pittsburg, Penn., has an-
nounced its Engineering Apprentice
Course for the coming year. It is the
desire of the company to enlist a num-
ber of graduates of technical schools
and universities in this course. They
will be placed in the shops and labora-
tories of the company, where they will
be enabled to obtain practical training
in the various branches. In this
course the work of the technical school
will be supplemented by practical train-
ing in both mechanical and electrical
engineering, and at the end of a two
years apprenticeship, the students who
have shown the proper aptness, will
be placed in various responsible posi-
tions with the company in their many
plants throught the United States.

The apprentice will continue work
in the course until he has prepared
himself for filling the regular positions
mentioned, and in no case will he be
expected to remain in the apprentice-
ship for a period of more than two
years. The pay for the first year of
apprenticeship will be 16 cents per
hour, while that for the second year
will be 18 cents per hour.

Each student is placed on probation
for the first three months. At the end
of this time, each applicant must ex-
ecute with the company a regular form
of agreement covering the entire term
of the course. During this term of pro-
bation, as well as during the whole
time of apprenticeship, the company
reserves the right to discharge any
student, for misbehavior, inattention
to duty, or for any like cause. It is ex-
pected that several of this year's grad-
uates from the engineering courses in
the University will avail themselves
of the opportunities afforded by this
course.
