TO LOSE BUILDING

UNIVERSITY ENGINEERS WILL GET NO NEW QUARTERS.

Money Goes to State Farm Instead—
\$150,000 Appropriated for Agricultural Structures.

The Senate spent yesterday afternoon in debating how to expend the one mill levy for the University. The bill is H. R. No. 76, and provides for the distribution of the proceeds of this fund.

As originally drawn the bill provides for an appropriation of \$100,000 for an Engineering building at the University. The finance committee struck this out, and substituted \$100,000 for new buildings at the State Farm.

This morning the senate voted out of the general fund \$50,000 for new

BIG DEBATE RALLY

Wisconsin Team Arrived Yesterday Morning—Swenson Will Probably Debate—Phi Alpha Tau.

Yesterday morning in chapel was held a mass meeting in the interest of the debate coming off tonight. It was the biggest event of the sort that has ever occurred at Nebraska. A "full house" greeted the speakers, the band played loud and strong. Genuine debating enthusiasm was aroused.

Professor Fogg in speaking characterized very effectively several of the men on present and past teams. Dean Pound described methods that used to be pursued in the days when a "big splash" counted for a great deal, and Professor Losey got off a good story

buildings at the Farm, and when the special bill came up this afternoon McKesson moved to reinstate the \$100,000 for the Engineering building and cut out that sum for the Farm buildings.

After a long debate the motion was defeated, 11 to 16, and there will be no Engineering building, but the State Farm will get a total of \$150,000 for new structures.

Although the senate did not make a direct appropriation for a University Engineering building there is a possibility that money will be secured from the mill levy for such a structure. The fact the \$150,000 goes to the State Farm may all own enough money to be saved from the regular levy for the Engineering building.

Senators McKesson, Burns and Sackett were active in trying to secure an appropriation for the University building yesterday but their efforts were in vain against the influence of Senators Aldrich and Patrick who opposed the bill.

Joseph Swenson, one of the best debaters on Nebraska's team, has been suffering for the past week from an attack of the mumps and much concern has been felt lest he be unable to enter the contest. At the latest word last night, he expressed himself as feeling that he would be present; the doctor in attendance also is hopeful.
