SUPERINTENDENT M'BRIEN

On New Acts of Legislature Regarding Schools.

"Our New School Laws" was the subject of a talk by Mr. J. L. McBrien, superintendent of public instruction, at Convocation yesterday morning. Of the seventeen new school laws just passed, Mr. McBrien spoke of the seven greatest ones, which are as follows:

(1) A law providing for a library in every school district; (2) a free high school law; (3) a law enlarging the scope and increasing the number of junior normal schools; (4) a law providing for normal training in high schools; (5) a law providing state aid to weak districts by appropriating \$50,000 therefor; (6) a law making the minimum entrance requirements to state normal schools a two-year high school education or its equivalent; (7) a law raising the standard of certifica tion of teachers by private and denominational schools by providing for a more rigid inspection each year by the state superintendent or by the state board of examiners for life certificates.

There is benefit to those from rural districts for at least three thousand students take advantage of the free high school law and in turn greater and comes to the state, so there is a leveling up. Mr. McBrien spoke briefly of the work planned in the normal departments of the Omaha and Beatrice high schools. Junior normal schools will be established in the northern, western and southern sections of the state.

#### "Kid" Wedge.

Tonight F. R. Wedge, better known as "Kid" Wedge in Omaha where he had a considerable reputation as a "welter-weight," will lead the men's meeting at the Y. M. rooms this evening.

He is at present attending the University, preparing himself to enter the Presbyterian ministry. He has been holding services in the city twice each Sunday, in the morning at the county jail and in the afternoon at the city jail. His talk will be of vital interest.

#### Glee Club to Make Trip.

The University Glee Club will start for Hastings and Fairmont Friday afternoon, where they will give concerts on Friday and Saturday nights respectively. The club expects to make a number of trips before the close of the semester, one of which will be to the cadet encampment, probably, which will be held at Beatrice.

#### McCormack to Lecture.

Dr. J. M. McCormack, national lecturer for the American Medical Association, will deliver his famous lecture on "Society and Health" at Fraternity Hall, Saturday, April 27, at 8:00 p. m.

Dr. McCormack is a very entertainin lecturer and has been a great factor in the pure food movement and for this, if no other consideration, will be worth hearing. Admission free.
