Returns From Trip.

E. E. Blackman of the Historical Society has returned from an exploring trip lasting several days. In the vicinity of Cario, Nebraska, an Indian mound was recently discovered, and, considerable interest being aroused, Mr. Blackman was urgently asked to come. Accompanied by three buggyloads of people, he visited the mound, which lies on the summit of one of the highest hills, and excavated to a depth of about six feet. The result, however, was somewhat disappointing; it was found to be a lone burial, of comparatively recent date, probably 1872 or 1873. The bones, which are but fairly well preserved, are those of an Indian who probably died on a hunt, and one whom his companions buried at their evening camp without ever taking to the general burying ground.
