**AGRICULTURAL GROUP.**  
Will Be Made More Practical Next Year.

The Industrial Faculty met Wednesday afternoon and decided to make a change in the course of study laid out in the General Agricultural group. This was done with a view to laying out a more practical course and one that would more nearly meet the needs of the average student.

The group is designed to meet the needs of two classes, those who desire to make practical application of their training in the management of land or in investigation, and those who desire to prepare themselves for teachers in high schools or colleges. Technical subjects which require little or no preliminary science are first taken up. Those requiring correlated science follow or accompany such science. The first three years of the course familiarize the student with general and fundamental agricultural principles. The fourth year is largely elective. Students electing this group should have had preparatory natural and physical science. College graduates of science courses can usually complete the course in two years.
