THE BASEBALL TEAM.

In the hard-earned victories of the Nebraska baseball team at Cornell and Minneapolis there is a cheering indication that eastern trip, which was begun a week ago, will not be so disastrous as the crushing defeats of the earlier contests had led many to expect it would be. At the beginning of the season the listless and mediocre playing of the Cornhuskers made pessimists of their most ardent supporters.

In the games with the Lincoln leaguers and the Wesleyan nine the entire Nebraska team played like a

and won two games. One of these victories was won from Minnesota by the score of 8 to 7.

In winning from Minnesota, and in helping keep up Nebraska's reputation of fighting hard against any Gopher team, the Cornhusker baseball nine has won the right to have the present trip called a successful one. If the Cornhuskers were to lose every game remaining on their schedule, the victory over the Gophers alone would entitle them to much glory. Not every Nebraska athletic team can defeat Minnesota.
