Left Tackle—B. D. Hartson of Ottumwa, Iowa. Weight, 165 pounds. Third year on 'Varsity. He is light, but is very level headed.

Left End—J. W. Flanagan of Clinton, Iowa. Weight, 150 pounds. Third year on 'Varsity. He is an old Clinton high school player. Exceedingly fast on running down punts and in passing the ball.

Quarter—H. L. Brundage of Kalamazoo, Michigan. Weight, 150 pounds. First on 'Varsity. He was quarterback on the 1906 freshman team. He is a good field general.

Right Half—W. C. Bleamaster of Clinton, Iowa. Weight 165 pounds. He is captain and this is his fourth year on the 'Varsity. He is the mainstay of the team.

Left Half—C. W. Bair of Des Moines, Iowa. Weight, 155 pounds. This is his second year on the 'Varsity. An old West Des Moines high school star. Is very fast.

Full Back—E. S. Turner of Turner, Iowa. Weight, 185 pounds. First year on 'Varsity. An old high school star. He was full back on the 1906 freshman team.
