#### THEMES.

The Junior and Senior Themes Will Soon Be Due.

Junior and Senior themes for 1907-1908 are due at University Hall 107 on the following dates as announced in the Calendar (page 253):

First Junior theme, December 9; Second Junior Theme, March 6; Senlor theme, January 13.
