Notes of the Game.
Kansas was forced to use several substitutes.

Time was taken out by Nebraska only once during the game.

The Kansas spectators thought the Cornhuskers had a great team.

Under the old football rules the score would have been 40 or 50 to 0.

It is a bad thing for the Jayhawkers that the eligibility committee did not get him.

Nebraska used the forward pass eight times, six trials resulting in good gains.

Director Delaney of the Kansas City Athletic Club witnessed the game and he was his money on Nebraska.

The Kansas forward pass was a failure. The Jayhawkers lost ground every time they tried to use it.

Angney, the regular quarter of the Kansas eleven played the last ten minutes, but failed to make a good showing.

Coach Pery of Kansas said Nebraska had a wonderful team and declared the line was the strongest he had seen this season.

Nebraska and Kansas have met on the gridiron fourteen times since 1890. Nebraska has won eight of the games and Kansas six of them.

Nebraska scored 12 points in the first half and four points in the second half. The Jayhawkers made their six points in the second half.

"Tub" Reed, the baby elephant who held down the left guard position for Kansas was played off his feet in the first half by Frum and in the second by Harte.

Howe, a St. Louis coach witnessed the game. He was getting a line on the play of both the elevens. St. Louis plays Kansas Saturday and Nebraska Thanksgiving.

Moñilaw, the coach of the University of Missouri eleven watched the game and gathered points on the Kansas style. His team plays the Jayhawkers Thanksgiving at St. Joseph.

Kansas City football fans want the Nebraska-Kansas game to be played in their city next year. The Kaw town is a hummer and would turn out a big crowd to see the Cornhuskers and Jayhawkers play.

Coach Cole was well pleased with the victory. He said the Kansans were outclassed and that the score of 16 to 6 did not indicate the relative strength of the elevens. He believed a score of 30 to 0 would be more representative of their strength.
