University of Illinois was laid on the afternoon of June 11. The principal address was delivered by Hon. H. M. Beardsley, mayor of Kansas City, Mo. One of the most satisfactory locations in the entire community has been secured for the structure. It will contain forty-four dormitories, a restaurant, bowling alleys, a large reception hall, parlor and game room, writing and reading room, and eight organization rooms. It will undoubtedly be in a very real sense the great student center of the University. The cost of the building, including furnishings and lot, will be \$105,000.
