Miss Alvie Venters, '00, has the science work in the Syracuse high school.

Alfred Crago, '05, is serving his third year as principal of the Tobias schools.

Arthur G. Kennedy, A. M. '05, is teaching in the Norfolk high school again this year.

C. N. Walton, '05, is superintendent of schools at Chadron and is president of the Northwest Nebraska Teachers' Association.
