**Basket-ball Rules.**  
 At a meeting of the Western inter-  
 collegiate Basket-ball league, held at  
 Chicago on Novmber 29th, the follow-  
 ing rules were adopted:

1. The maximum fee to be paid a  
 referee in a collegiate contest be \$10  
 and that both teams shall share equal-  
 ly the expense and fee of such official.
2. The referee shall be instructed  
 on 'out of bounds plays' to run to a  
 position at right angles to the players  
 where the ball went out and indicate  
 by pointing his arm and clearly an-  
 nouncing to whom the ball belongs.
3. Blocking of a player not in pos-  
 session of the ball shall be permitted  
 if the hands or arms are not used in  
 interfering with his progress.
