## COLLINS GUILTY.

(Continued from Page 1.)

This at drill at the University of Nebraska, about 5:30 p. m., November 12, 1907.

Specification 2nd.—In that Cadet Corporal C. H. Collins, Company "C", University Cadets, did, without provocation, use violent and abusive language to Cadet Private Sam Westfield.

This at and immediately after drill at the University of Nebraska, about the hours of 5:30 and 6:00 p. m., November 12, 1907.

Plea.—Not guilty.

Finding.—Of the first specification, of the second specification, guilty except the words "and immediately after," of the excepted words, not guilty.

Of the charge, guilty.

Sentence.—To be publicly reprimanded. Action.—The sentence, though inadequate, is approved.

The evidence in this case shows that Corporal Collins exceeded his authority in giving instructions to a private at the time and under the circumstances cited; that he used unauthorized force in so doing and that he violently resented a dignified and reasonable remonstrance made at a proper time.

Corporal Collins is reminded that military authority must be exercised with kindness and justice and that he is forbidden to injure those under his authority by tyrannical or capricious conduct or by abusive language. His action in attacking a smaller man whose power of resistance was lessened by his peculiar position in the battalion must be characterized as mean. In giving way to an outburst of temper under such conditions, Corporal Collins has shown himself unfit to command others.
