The Appalachian Forest Reserve. Whereas:
There is a distinct need for proper forest preservation in view of our rapidly diminishing forest supplies that this policy should especially prevail over areas which are preeminently suited for forest growth and of lit tle economic use; and

Whereas:
Forests are essential for the pros perity of the nation; that some means must be devised for curbing our reck less waste of timber and that means must be provided whereby we may perpetuate large areas of timber which will serve in preventing a serious tim ber famine with a consequent disorganization of immense industries in al portions of the United States; and,
Whereas
The area proposed for National For ests in the White Mountains and the Southern Appalachians is designed to include forest lands which are of more value in regulating stream flow than any other purpose and that the management of these forests, by the government would conclusively prove the value of conservative forestry meth ods for the entire United States;
THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; That the Nebraska Park and Forestry Association does hereby declare itself heartily in favor of the bill for acquiring National Forests in the White Mountains and in the Southern Appal achian Mountains; and, be it it furcher resolved, that a copy of these resolutions be sent to Secretary of Agri culture Wilson, U. S. Forester Pin chot, and the Nebraska senators and Congressmen.
The foregoing was adopted by the Nebraska Park and Forestry Association at its annual meeting in Lincoln January 23, 1908.
