**REGENTS MEET.**  
 Create College of Education—Dean Fordyce at its Head.  
 The Board of Regents met Friday and created the College of Education, with Dean Fordyce of Wesleyan University as dean. The salary of Dean Fordyce will be the same as the other deans, \$2,400 a year. The department of Education has been asking for a College of Education for some time, so that the work might be carried on to a better advantage. In order to give a thorough training to high school teachers a model school will be conducted at Fourteenth and W streets.  
 No action was taken in regard to the purchase of a new athletic field, except to appoint a committee to confer with a committee of the Athletic Board. The board was reorganized and J. S. Dales was re-elected secretary. Several other committees were appointed, but nothing definite was accomplished. Another meeting will take place the last of this week.

**Convention a Success.**  
 The thirteen delegates who attended the Y. M. C. A. convention at Norfolk came back this morning feeling that their time had been well spent and that it was one of the best state conventions ever held in Nebraska.  
 The prevailing opinion among the delegates is that Norfolk will at an early date have an association building, the business men of Norfolk expressing a sentiment toward that direction. One business man made a noise like \$2,000.

Of the 215 delegates present from all over the state, over one-half were students. Rev. Lortland of Omaha and "Dad" Elhart of Chicago were the most popular speakers.  
 The two next Wednesday evening meetings in the Y. M. C. A. rooms will be given up to a report from the delegates from the University.

**Y. W. C. A.**  
 One of the largest women's meetings since the organization of the women's mass meetings took place last Sunday afternoon in the Lyric Theatre. Miss Josephine C. Walker, the returned missionary from China, gave the address of the service and her talk was unusually interesting and was listened to with considerable enjoyment by every one present. Miss Walker is very simple in manner, but she very ably gives the real, practical side of missionary work in a foreign country. Her word pictures are vivid, especially those of the people with whom she has been associated for twenty years, and she is also able to make her audience feel "at home" with her subject and with these strange people. The service was made beautiful by the songs of the First Baptist Church Quartette, consisting of Mrs. Enslow, Mrs. Conant, and Messrs. Ireland and Agee. Mrs. Conant also gave a solo, "Lead Kindly Light."
