**Theatrical.**

Puccini's fascinating Japanese grand opera, "Madam Butterfly," is to return to Lincoln for a night performance at the Oliver on Tuesday, March 3d. This famous masterpiece will be presented by Mr. Henry W. Savage's celebrated English Grand Opera Company with its new forces of imported artists and grand opera orchestra of nearly fifty symphony players.

Lincoln music lovers have been looking to a second opportunity to hear "Madam Butterfly" ever since it took the city by storm last year. Manager Zehring reports that such advance interest has been taken that several of the boxes are already spoken for and orders for seats are being received from surrounding points.

Mr. Frank C. Mayne, general representative for Mr. Savage, arrived yesterday to arrange all preliminaries. Speaking of "Madam Butterfly," he said:

"This opera, with its haunting melodies, its deeply interesting romantic story, its alluring scenic beauties, with its superb artists and splendid orchestra, has been a greater success on its second tour than last year. In fact, no operatic offering Mr. Savage has ever sent out has equalled the sensation produced by this flowery Japanese opera.

"To produce 'Madam Butterfly' Mr. Savage is credited with having organized the finest of all his companies. For several months his agents visited the continental opera houses in search of singers who are required to display a special fitness for the exacting roles. This year his orchestra was picked from the players heretofore associated with the Boston Symphony, Theodore Thomas and Cincinnati Festival orchestras. Four rows of seats must be removed to provide space for the musicians.

"During the recent New York engagement Mr. Savage introduced three new prima donnas in the title role and four new tenors, the best he has ever had. All are with the company throughout its tour. The cast arranged for Lincoln will give an opportunity to hear most of the favorites who have captivated the East."

A hearing will be had March 14, 1908, in the offices of the commission, at which all persons interested in the subject matter will be given an opportunity to be heard.
