Careful inquiry is made as to the teacher's teaching power, his ability to interest and win and control his pupils, his sympathy with them and his personal hold on them. Pupils who are candidates for scholarships remain in school a year or two longer than others and rarely enter upon their college work till they are nineteen years of age. Although much stress is laid upon the mother tongue in England, France has a long lead in that teaching today. Because of the remoteness of both French and English history and their connection with general history, it has a prominent place in their curriculum. The attempt to instill patriotism in the children through the teaching of civics is much less in England than in France. Through the organization of classics associations the interest in Greek and Latin is being maintained. The purpose of an examination in both countries is conceded to be to test the acquisition of knowledge and the ability to use knowledge."

Kirschner's Body Found.

While working on a surveying party with the Burlington near Casper, Wyoming, last June, C. F. Kirschner of Liberty, Nebr., and M. A. Deffer were drowned in the Platte river. They had gone out on the river in a boat to have their pictures taken, when the boat tipped over in the swift current and they were unable to get out. Deffer's body was found about a week afterwards, but Kirschner's body was not found until last Sunday. The funeral of Mr. Kirschner will be held in Blue Springs today.

Mr. Deffer was a third year mechanical engineer student and Mr. Kirschner was a third year civil engineer. Both intended to be back in school this year.

Pan-Hellenic Election.

The delegates of the pan-hellenic dance met yesterday and elected the following officers: M. A. Mills, Jr., chairman, and Ed. Coufal and "Cluck" McLaughlin masters of ceremonies.
