receive a silver medal, second place a bronze medal, and third and fourth places ribbons.

10. Each frat belonging to this organization will be assessed two dollars annually for the indoor tack meet.

11. There shall be a silver cup presented to the winning team, to be kept by them for one year. Any team winning the meet three times (not necessarily in succession) shall keep the cup permanently.

12. The President shall have the power to appoint a committee to control each branch of athletic activity participated in by the fraternities and also an eligibility committee.

13. The events for the annual indoor meet shall be as follows: 15-yard dash, 12-pound shot put, fence vault, pole vault, running high jump, running high kick, rope climb, standing broad jump, three standing broad jumps, tug-of-war—six men, obstacle relay race—four men.
