Haggard, pole vaulter at Drake, will try for the Olympic games.

The Navy fencers defeated Yale by six bouts to three in a dual meet.

Davey, star quarter-miler at Michigan, will leave college to go to the Philippines.

Shaw, the Dartmouth hurdler, will compete for the Chicago Athletic Club next season.

West Point baseball team will be coached by Matthewson, the big league idol of a few years ago.

Comstock, captain of the Chicago freshman track team recently set a new Bartlett gymnasium record of 4:46 2-5 for the mile.

Rev. J. P. Frieden, former head of St. Ignatius College in San Francisco, has been chosen to the leadership of St. Louis University.

Hugo Bezdek, famous fullback of the University of Chicago, has been engaged to coach the University of Arkansas eleven next season.

There will be no football game between Dartmouth and Michigan next fall. The Dartmouth faculty have telegraphed to Michigan to that effect.

Haskins, the intercollegiate champion in the mile and half-mile, will not represent Pennsylvania this year. Haskins is an Australian who entered dentistry at Pennsylvania in 1903.

Drake University has a very promising track team this year. Of the men who met the champion Grinnell team last season, only three of the point winners will be absent. Drake has secured a very hard schedule.

As the Pensylvania authorities refuse to erect extra stands on Franklin field, the annual game between the Army and Navy will not take place at Philadelphia next fall. It is rumored that the game may be played at New York instead, and that both teams are highly in favor of the change.
