Nebraska Team Suffers Three Succes-
sive Defeats.

The baseball team has so far met
with unruly handling on the part of
the teams it has met. In every game
so far there has been a bad inning
which has given the other team its

failed to do.

Yesterday they again lost to Grin-
nell in a game which gave every prom-
ise of being a victory for the Corn-
huskers, but ragged support of Beltzer
lost them the victory in the eighth
inning.

hits were driven by the Congregation-
alists off of Buck Beltzer's speedy del-
ivery, while Nebraska forced them
to use three pitchers, hitting the ball
