 tants shall be started again in the middle of the space.
 12. Contestants must acknowledge all touches in an audible voice. If a contestant persistently fails to acknowledge touches the judges may award two touches to his opponent for each offense.
 13. The judges may award to each contestant in each bout a maximum of .50 of a point for defense, .50 of a point for attack and .50 of a point for general good form, or any any part thereof, the total of all points made by a contestant being his score.
 The judges will be Captain Workizer and Mr. C. A. Reimers. The entries are Woods, Smith, Farrow, Peterson, Rutledge, Villars, Wilson, Schmidt, Olmstead, Jaffords, Grosbach, Bargquist, Moorehouse and McElroy. Admission is free.

 Frank Edgerton, 1900, told of the work of Nebraska graduates in Washington. Dr. Andrews related interesting facts regarding the conditions in the University—Washington Post.
