 Methods.

The meeting was called to order by  
 Mr. Scott, who finished his opening re-  
 marks by introducing the speaker of  
 the evening, Professor Hinman. Space

 concerning the able lecture which was  
 read to the club. His main point, how-  
 ever, was that times were changing  
 and the minister to be up-to-date must  
 also change. The people are becoming  
 more and more educated and they nat-  
 urally look for higher work from the  
 minister. To correspond with this  
 change the large seminaries are con-  
 stantly moving near to the universit-  
 ies so that their students may profit by  
 the combined advantages of the two  
 schools.

 given before then end of the school  
 year, one by Mr. Harrison of Chicago  
 University and another by Mr. McDon-  
 aid of Princeton.
