choose almost the two lightest men on the squad.

Worthwile at Right Guard.

Worthwile, the hammer throwing track athlete, is slated for right guard. He weighs 163 pounds. Ehrhorn, the left fielder on the baseball team, is the coach's choice for left guard. He weighs 165 pounds. Their substitutes will be Smith, a 195 pounder, and Bohlander, a 186 pounder, practically the two biggest men in the squad. Only two men on the team with which Stagg will open the game with Purdue weigh less than Worthwile. They are Iddings, the veteran 158 pound half, and Pat Page, the 150 pound veteran end. Captain Steffen at quarter tips the scales even with the left guard.

"We have been forced to rely on shiftiness," is the excuse of Stagg for his pair of "banty" guards. "If we wanted merely weight we could have it in the line, but we don't want weight alone. The big fellows now bow to the little fellows in our line."

Stagg's move in sending such small men into the line is almost as revolutionary as any of his previous progressive innovations. He has been forced to use the "banties" in the line in order to develop a shifty front, as his big fellows have been outplayed in the new game, where so much agility and endurance is required.

May Be Surprised by Move.

This news of a pair of feather-weight guards on the Maroon team will doubtless be received at Campaign with more than passing interest, as the daily reports from the camp of the Illini state that the coaches have been concentrating their attention in building up a "stonewall" line. Stagg seems to be breaking away from the idea of an immovable line. He desires a line of men that can move and move fast.

Chicago's team will present other unusual features in the way of weight. His back field, for instance, will average up within five pounds of the line. The backs will average 165 1-2 pounds and the linemen 170, making the total average of the team 168 4-11 pounds.

put on the field in many years, and it is also the speediest—probably the fastest bunch of eleven players that ever wore the maroon. Seven of the eleven are veteran members of the track team; an eighth player is a swimming star, and a ninth a fast fielding baseball player, leaving only a tackle and a full back who have not had experience in other branches of athletics where speed is requisite.

Paulus and Currie, promising new men, appeared at Camp Randall this afternoon. Currie was a star guard on the Ripon team two years ago and Paulus played full back on the freshman team last year. Both men weigh 180 pounds, and as guards are valuable additions to the squad. Osthoff was shifted from tackle to guard, and it is felt that Coach Barry will now have no trouble in filling the hole in the line.

The men were put through several new plays, first attempts were made with the forward pass, and the charging was tried today. Capt. Rogers is authority for the statement that scrimmage will commence this week, and members of the team believe that tomorrow will see its inauguration.
