ROSS QUILTS REPUBLICAN RANKS.
 Former Nebraskan Says Old Machine Will Be in Control.

Madison, Wis., Oct. 20.—A sensation was caused here last night when Professor E. A. Ross of the university faculty, a noted sociologist and lifetime republican, declared that when President Roosevelt goes out of power the old republican organization will come into the leadership. He took issue with Prof. W. A. Scott, head of the banking department of the university, on the guaranty bank deposit proposal, and declared that "Taft's party is more in sympathy with the stockholders than with the depositors."

The old machine has not moved out of its tracks, and has succeeded in nominating Joe Cannon's waterlog for vice president," said Prof. Ross. "The election of senators by direct vote, publicity of campaign expenditures and planks in favor of labor legislation were thrown off the republican platform—principles for which we have fought in Wisconsin."

Many of the university students who formed the LaFollette organization have joined the democratic organization.
