CHICAGO SETS A NEW RECORD.

Correspondence Courses Show Big Increased Enrollment.

The Correspondence School of the University of Chicago is expanding with phenomenal strides. Its growth as a department is without precedent in the annals of Chicago's history. The report of the correspondence Over forty illustrations will appear study department for 1907-1908 shows an increase of 18 per cent in the number of students enrolled over that of last year, which was a banner year

The total enrollment at present is exactly 2,200, which is 20 per cent of the total number of students matriculated in the university. In the department there are 231 instructors, giving 421 courses. Four new courses have been arranged for since the last circulars were printed. These are all of a practical nature, two being intended for teachers and school principals. These deal with the problems of school supervision and class management. Superintendent Chancellor, who is in charge of the courses, reports 150 teachers already enrolled.
