Believed "King" Will Stay at Nebraska Yet Another Year and That Yost Will Centinue With Wolverines.

ANN ARBOR, Mich., Nov. 20 .- Coincident with the departure of the Michigan football team tonight for Syracuse, where the wolverines close their season Saturday, appeared the rumor that "King" Cole would succeed Yost as coach of the Michigan team, the change to take effect next fall.

Yost's contract with the Michigan athletic association has another year to run, and for that reason little credence in the reported change is entertained by the leading athletic spirits here. Perhaps Yost has made up his mind to give up football, and, if he has, Cole would be as apt to be tendered the position as anybody.
