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ANDREWS IS HONORED

UNIVERSITY SENATE PASSES RESOLUTIONS OF RESIGNATION.

FACULTY REGRETS WITHDRAWAL

Services of the Chancellor as Moderator, Executive and Scholar Strongly Commended by University Professors.

The university senate at a meeting yesterday afternoon passed resolutions of regret on the resignation of E. Benjamin Andrews from the chancellorship of the university. The senate in these resolutions state their belief in the ability of Chancellor Andrews and they offer firm commendation for his work at Nebraska. The text of the resolutions follows:

"The senate desires to express and record its deep regret that the relations between its members and their president are about to terminate, and to voice its sorrow that the impaired health of the chancellor makes his retirement from active duties necessary.

"1. His largeness and facile dignity in the office of moderator will be greatly missed in our future deliberations.

"2. The experience and fame of Chancellor Andrews, gained in earlier years of service as college president and publicist, have enabled the university, since his connection with it, to be more widely known and better recognized as an institution of learning.

"3. In Chancellor Andrews the colleges and schools constituting the university have had the services of a wise guide and counsellor, and under him their inter-relations have been conserved with a due regard for the rights of all.

"4. The work of departments in existence at his inauguration has had in him an enthusiastic supporter, and he has greatly enlarged the scope and functions of the university by the addition of such new departments and organizations as seemed called for from time to time.

"5. Chancellor Andrews has been in a large sense an administrator of the university for the educational welfare of the whole state, and he has greatly aided the university and its sister colleges in Nebraska in maintaining relations of mutual helpfulness and esteem.

"6. During his administration the students have found in him a friend invariably and thoroughly devoted to their highest good.

"7. His wide and accurate scholarship as well as his broad-mindedness and large-heartedness have won for him an abiding place in the hearts not only of the members of the various faculties but of the people of the commonwealth, as well."

Balenti Receives the Ball.

Birkner kicked off to Balenti on the Carlisle fifteen yard line. The ball was returned to the 20-yard line. Hauser and Thorpe drew five yards at left tackle. Balenti punted to Beltzer on Nebraska's 50-yard line. A forward pass from Beltzer to Harvey gave Nebraska twenty yards. The ball was on the Carlisle 45-yard line. From lost on a tackle play. Cooke made three yards on an end run. Beltzer punted to Balenti on the Carlisle 10-yard line. The ball was returned to the 30-yard line. Payne ran through the right side of the line for fifteen yards. The Indians then, by several plunges at the line and on gains around the ends, took the ball to the Nebraska 25-yard line. 

Birkner kicked off to Balenti at the Carlisle 25-yard line. He was downed in his tracks. Thorpe made four yards off right tackle. Payne dropped the ball on the next play but recovered the ball. Payne punted to Miner, who fumbled the ball on Nebraska's 45-yard line. Thorpe caught up the ball and ran forty-five yards for a touchdown. Thorpe kicked goal. Score: Nebraska, 6; Carlisle, 19. The half ended a minute after this goal was kicked.

Both teams started the second half with their line-ups intact. Balenti kicked off to Beltzer on the Nebraska 5-yard line. He took the ball to the 20-yard line. Miner punted to Balenti on the Nebraska 50-yard line. Winnie was substituted for Thorpe. He made five yards on the first play. Little Old Man and Hendricks carried the ball fifteen yards on line plays

and short end runs. Balenti punted to Bentley on Nebraska's 10-yard line. Miner punted back to Winnie on the Nebraska 50-yard line. Hendricks and Payne took the ball to the Nebraska 45-yard line. The Indians were penalized five yards for off-side play. Hauser kicked to Bentley on Nebraska's 35-yard line. An onside kick by Beltzer gave Nebraska the ball at the center of the field.

Nebraska Is Penalized.

Nebraska was penalized fifteen yards on the first play for holding. The ball was on Nebraska's 45-yard line. Miner punted to the Carlisle 50-yard line. Collins got the ball. Birkner ran around left end for fifteen yards. Beltzer kicked to Balenti on the Carlisle fifteen yard line. Payne failed on an end run. On the next play he punted to Bentley at the center of the field. Hendricks picked up the ball after Bentley fumbled it on Nebraska's 40-yard line.

The Indians then, on several end runs, took the ball down to the 10-yard line. They carried it through to the 2-yard line, where Nebraska held. Miner punted out from behind the goal line. The ball went to Carlisle on Nebraska's 35-yard line. On two gains the Indians carried the ball to the 25-yard line, where Hauser missed a goal from placement.

Indians Work a Pass.

Miner kicked out from the twenty-five-yard line to Balenti. The ball was on the forty yard line of the Cornhuskers. A forward pass from Winnie to Balenti placed the ball on the Nebraska 10-yard line. The Cornhusker line could not hold and Payne went over for a touchdown. Hauser kicked goal. Score: Nebraska, 6; Carlisle, 25.

Carlisle made several substitutes, taking out Balenti, Hendricks, Little

Old Man, and putting in Kelly, Libby and Thomas. After the next kickoff the ball was soon punted to the Nebraska 15-yard line, where Nebraska could not advance the oval any further than the 25-yard line. Bentley fumbled and Carlisle took the ball. A forward pass for twenty yards from Libby to Kelly gave the Indians another touchdown. Hauser kicked goal. Score: Nebraska, 6; Carlisle, 31.

After the next kickoff the Indians got the ball on their own 40-yard line. Kelly took the ball to the center of the field. Hauser kicked to Nebraska's 40-yard line. Wauseka recovered the ball. Hauser punted to Nebraska's 20-yard line where Libby got the ball. A forward pass from Libby to Wauseka then gave the Indians another touchdown. Hauser kicked goal. Score: Nebraska, 6; Carlisle, 37. The game ended two minutes later with the ball in possession of Nebraska on its 30-yard line.
