Mr. Stevens, the Cotner coach, says that his team has been working hard for several weeks and that they are in remarkably good form for so early in the season and under the circumstances he thinks that they ought to show up wel lagainst their Cornhusker opponents. In the matter of practice this fall the Cotner players have a distinct advantage over the varsity men-they have been working oul ever since early in the fall under his direction and in the matter of team work they are believed to be farther advanced than the Cornhuskers.
