### ONE WESTERN PLAYER HONORED

CHICAGO, Ill., Dec. 17.-Walter Steffen, captain and quarterback on the champion University of Chicago team of 1908, is the only westerner to be honored with a place on Walter Camp's All-American football eleven. which appears in the current issue of Collier's Weekly.

This honorary team is picked anpually by Camp, the dean of American college football. Its appearance is awaited eagerly from year to year on account of the Yale man's standing in the gridiron world. And when a western player is given a place supporters of the game in this section of the country are all the more joyous because Camp's duties prevent him from seeing much of the sport as played out here.

That the east was impressed by reports of Steffen's prowess is evident O from what the Yale advisory coach has to say of him. He styles the Maroon the best general of the year and says he got more out of the new game 6 than any other man in the country. n warding off tacklers. Further, he calls him the best quarter in the land for getting the work out of his team.

Other places on Mr. Camp's eleven are divided among Harvard, Yale, Pennsylvania, and Dartmouth, each of Q which colleges is given two men, and Princeton and Syracuse, which are honored with one player apiece. John Messmer, Wisconsin's big guard, placed on the second eleven. Pat Page of the Maroons and Van Hook of Illinois are given berths on the third team.

To the surprise of westerners in general, "Germany" Schulz, the Micalgan captain and center, is not honored with anything but mention. The backbone of the Wolverine team is spoken of briefly however, and Camp explains his failure to select him by the fact that he was unable to get into the fray early in the season on account of faculty rulings and that his condition prevented his lasting out either the Penn or the Syracus. out either the Penn or the Syracus:
