

JOLTS SUMMER BALL

MEETING OF COLLEGE MEN DOES NOT FAVOR IT.

NOW DECLARED A DEAD ISSUE

Coach Stagg of Chicago University Gives His Opinion on Subject and Says Rules Will Be Retained.

CHICAGO, Jan. 5.—That summer baseball stands little chance of ever receiving the sanction of the leading was the report brought back to the Midway yesterday by Coach A. A. Stagg, who returned from Saturday's annual meeting of the Inter-collegiate Athletic Association of the United States in New York.

Coach Stagg, who argued against summer baseball in a debate at the athletic meeting, found his side of the question the popular one. According to the coach, he ascertained that the great majority of the college officials who attended the gathering, are opposed to any opening up of the strict rules against summer baseball now in force in the "big eight," and in most of the eastern schools.

While no resolutions on the subject were adopted in New York, it is believed that the sentiment brought out at the meeting will dispose of any attempt to legislate in favor of summer playing. Coach Stagg is of the opinion that the reported attempt to change the conference rules at the June meeting of the "big eight" representatives will not materialize.

Sentiment Is Unfavorable.

"The summer baseball question was not put to a vote at the meeting, but I found the sentiment to be largely against allowing athletes to play in the summer," said Stagg. "I believe the great majority of those present were against summer baseball, although the affirmative side of the debate was warmly supported by Pro-H. G. Tufts and Profesosr J. P. Welch of Pennsylvania state agricultural

"In my opinion, the summer baseball question is now a dead issue. I don't think anyone is going to bring it up again, at least in the west, and I am pretty sure that the Eastern schools which have rules similar to our own will retain them. I was pleased to find the sentiment strong for the conference stand on the matter."

ceach Stagg took his first peek at his track and baseball material yesterday afternoon. The winter season in both departments was officially started, although neither track nor baseball candilates turned out in force. Coach Stagg will take the squads in hand today and put them tarough their first real session of the 3 (ET

The basket-ball and swimming candidates also started work. Dr. Caycroft had a large squad out for basketball, and expects to have his team ready for their first game within two weeks. Coach Knudson had a fair sized squad out for swimming and polo practice.
