The athletic council last night authorized Dr. Hutchins, athletic director, to arrange for a schedule of twelve games for the coming season, six to be played in Madison and the rest away from home.

Two games each will be played with Chicago, Illinois, Purdue, Northwestern and Minnesota. The dates are not definitely fixed. Two remaining games will be played with Marquette college or some other small institution.


