**DON'T NEED GREEK**

**NEW REGULATION REGARDING RHODES SCHOLARS.**

**CAN MAKE UP LANGUAGES LATER**

**HAVE NINE MONTHS AFTER EXAMINATIONS TO DO WORK.**

Candidates Can Take Other Tests and Can Then Make Up Greek Requirement After Being Picked for English Scholarship.

According to a letter recently received by Chancellor Avery from the Rhodes Scholarship Trust, American candidates for entrance to Oxford will not need to know Greek prior to taking the competitive examinations for selection among the Rhodes beneficiaries. The tests in other subjects may be taken as usual and the student will be given an opportunity after his selection as winner of the competitive examination to make up the language requirement.

According to the terms of the Rhodes bequest, each state in the American union is entitled to one resident student at Oxford university. The selection is made by a competitive examination of all candidates presenting themselves, the only requirements for permission to take the examination being legal residence in the state where in the test is held. The examinations are on Greek, Latin and Mathematics, and they are usually hard enough to tax the capacity of the candidates thoroughly.

**Great Convenience.**  
 Owing to the fact that in American schools there are many otherwise brilliant students without a knowledge of Greek, there are annually a considerable number who are not eligible to compete. They do not consider it worth while to take the Greek when their chance of passing the competition successfully is by no means assured.

Under the new regulations the student who has no Greek can take the other examinations in any case. If he is successful in these he can then prepare his Greek for entrance to Ox-

ford. The new requirements do not make Greek unnecessary for admission under the Rhodes Trust. They simply give the American scholars the right to study the Greek after his ability to enter is assured as far as other requirements are concerned.

The regular examinations will hereafter be held in December. The Greek examinations for entrance to Oxford are regularly held in September. The student will thus have nine months in which to make up his Greek requirements, which it is believed is sufficient for the average student winner of the Rhodes prize.

At the present time Nebraska is represented at Oxford by Samuel Rinaker, a former University of Nebraska student. He was appointed two years ago.

 he has delayed so long the signing-up of a contract with Nebraska has led the local athletic mentors to believe that he is awaiting action at Michigan.

 The local authorities are anxious to hear from him, for if he is not to

come back they want to know it at once that they may choose a man to take his place. If the decision is delayed much longer all of the good football coaches in the country will have been hired and Nebraska will have a hard time getting a suitable man to succeed "King" Cole.  
 The fraternity baseball men have a committee at work now drafting a schedule for the coming season. It is expected this will be ready some time next week.  
 Just now the Greeks are in a quandary as to what to do for a field on which to play their game this spring. They have three places open which they are now considering—Antelope park, the state farm and the Vine street grounds. They desire to engage Antelope park if possible, and are now trying to arrange with Manager Green for the use of that field. In case they fail to close up a deal for Antelope park it is probable they will have to fit up the Vine street grounds, for the distance to the state farm from the university makes it such an inconvenient place for going to play baseball that many of the Greeks do not wish to consent to playing out there.

**RALPH WEAVERLING WANTS JOB**  
**Ex-class President Seeks Cornhusker Managership.**  
 Ralph Weaverling has announced his candidacy for the business managership of the 1910 Cornhusker, subject to the decision of the sophomore class. Weaverling is running in opposition to V. C. Hascall, who started his campaign for the place Tuesday morning. The election may be held next Tuesday, but it is likely that it will be postponed until such time as the aspirants for the place have time to better line up their supporters.

Weaverling entered the university in the fall of 1907, at which time he was elected president of the freshman class. He engaged in a conflict with the university authorities over the kidnapping of Dale McDonald early in the following spring and for that reason he removed to Kansas university for the semester. He returned to Nebraska last fall. His home is in Beatrice.

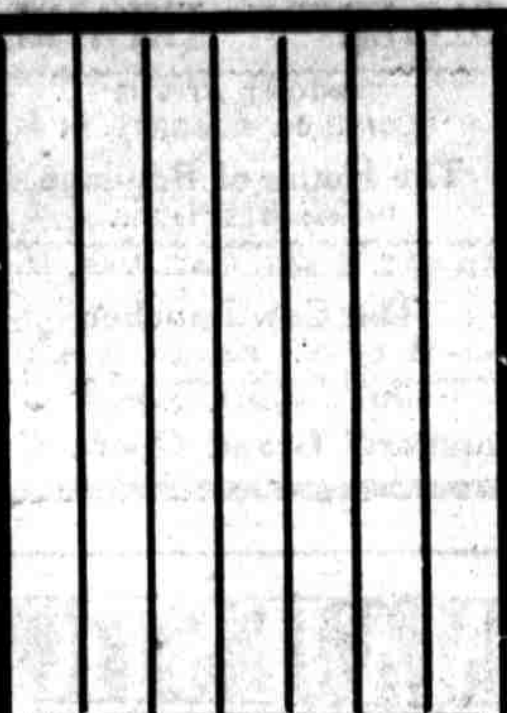

**CARNEGIE PENSION BILL TODAY**

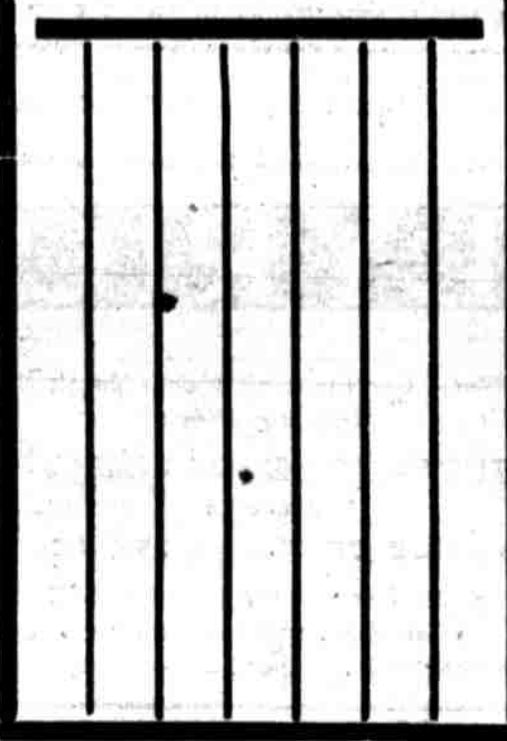
State House Representatives to Act on Measure.
