points. It is further ordered upon recommendation of the committee as

amended that: "Hereafter no college credit be given for any work comprised in the regular four year high school course except on recommendation of committee on accredited schools to department concerned and then only after examination."

On recommendation of Director Grummann it is ordered:

That permission be granted to students to pursue summer work abroad under the following provisions:

A. That students desiring credit be required to register in the summer session and submit detailed plans of their work with their application for registration.

B. That no student be granted more han six hours credit for such work.

C. That no credit be given for such work except upon the examination of he student by a committee of three members of the university faculty, said committee to be appointed by the chancellor of the university.

other uniersities.

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
