change optional points from 11 to 14 points.

It is further ordered upon recommendation of the committee as amended that:

"Hereafter no college credit be given for any work comprised in the regular four year high school course except on recommendation of committee on accredited schools to department concerned and then only after examination."

On recommendation of Director Grumann it is ordered:

That permission be granted to students to pursue summer work abroad under the following provisions:

A. That students desiring credit be required to register in the summer session and submit detailed plans of their work with their application for registration.

B. That no student be granted more than six hours credit for such work.

C. That no credit be given for such work except upon the examination of the student by a committee of three members of the university faculty, said committee to be appointed by the chancellor of the university.

SOPHS MEET TODAY

TO ELECT MINOR OFFICERS AND FILL CORNHUSKER PLACE.

THREE CANDIDATES WANT JOB

PATTERSON, HASCALL AND R. WEAVERLING IN RACE.

Business Managership of Nebraska Annual for 1910 Cause of Fast Three-Cornered Race With Result Unknown.

The sophomore class will meet in Memorial hall at 11:30 today for the election of a vice-president, a secretary, a treasurer and the business manager of the 1910 Cornhusker. Three candidates are out for the latter office and the race is close. There are no contests for any of the other places.

The principal thing of interest at the sophomore meeting today will be the election of a business manager for next year's university annual. Under the constitution of the Cornhusker established in 1907, the junior class each spring elects an editor-in-chief to head the staff of the annual for the subsequent year. The sophomores at the same time elect a business manager who shall manage the finances of the book, which is published during his junior year. By these terms the election of the business head of the 1910 book falls to the present second year class and the place has been made the object of a lively race between three candidates during the past two weeks.

The Usual Question.

The campaign in the sophomore class has to a considerable extent developed about the same question which has agitated the politics of the class ever since its organization in the fall of 1907. It is claimed that one of the candidates for the business managership is a member of the sophomore organization known as Iron Sphinx. With this allegation goes the charge that the Iron Sphinx is a political society of bad influence and that

for this reason its candidate should be defeated. V. C. Hascall, the first to announce his candidacy for the coveted position, is declared to be the man who in this contest represents the class organization.

Hascall is a member of no college organization other than the Sphinx. He was on the second football team last fall and did speedy work at quarter. Weaverling is a member of the Alpha Tau Omega fraternity. He was president of the class in the first semester of the freshman year and at the close of the semester he was expelled from the university because of his attitude in connection with the kidnapping of Dale McDonald, chairman of the sophomore hop. He went to Kansas for the rest of the year and returned to Nebraska last fall.

Patterson is a non-frat man, who has held no class office during his attendance in the university. He lives in Lincoln and is well-known among members of his class, and especially popular with the "barbs." It is said that Patterson will draw some votes from the fraternity members of the class, not all of these being willing to stand together in the traditional but much abused attitude of opposition to non-frat candidates.

A triangular debating league similar to the league in which Nebraska is interested has been recently organized by Harvard, Yale and Princeton. As is the custom in the debating league in which Nebraska is interested, this new triangular league will hold all the debates on the same evening. Each university will have an affirmative and negative team. One team will debate at home and the other at one of the other universities.
