THE SOPHOMORES ELECT MINOR CLASS OFFICERS.
WEAVERLING WINS ONLY FIGHT
EX-PRESIDENT OF CLASS GETS BUSINESS MANAGERSHIP.
Patterson of Lincoln Second Man in Three-cornered Contest for Managing Finances of the 1910 Cornhusker.

Ralph Weaverling of Beatrice was yesterday elected business manager of the 1910 Cornhusker by the sophomore class. Weaverling won on the second ballot by a vote of 65 to 41 over R. W. Patterson of Lincoln. Hascall was third man, he dropping out after the first vote.
L. C. Osterhout of David City was elected vice-president by acclamation. By a similar procedure, Miss Esther Devalon of Omaha was elected secretary. Miss Isabelle Williams of Lincoln, treasurer, and James E. Lawrence of Beatrice, sergeant-at-arms.
The business managership of the annual was the only office for which there was a contest. V. C. Hascall, R. W. Patterson and R. E. Weaverling were the three aspirants for that position and prior to the meetings it was generally admitted that the contest would run close between Weaverling and Patterson.
Laws Held Caucus.

The freshman laws materially aided Weaverling's campaign by holding a caucus during the morning and deciding upon the Beatrice man as their candidate. This threw a solid support to Weaverling which gave him the necessary majority. Patterson's vote was scaled down somewhat by the necessary absence of a number of men who had been counted upon to cast their ballots for him.
The meeting was called to order by President Morehouse, who first briefly expressed his thanks to the class for their election of himself at a recent meeting. He then announced that nominations would be dispensed with and

the three candidates were named by the chair. A ballot was immediately taken, with the resulting vote of 50 for Weaverling, 32 for Patterson and 24 for Hascall. Hascall's name was dropped and on the second ballot the vote was 65 to 41 in favor of Weaverling.

Others Selected.
Election to the class offices was made in all cases by acclamation. L. C. Osterhout was so elected vice-president. Miss Esther Devalon, class secretary; Miss Isabelle Williams, treasurer, and James E. Lawrence, sergeant-at-arms.
R. E. Weaverling, the business manager of next year's Cornhusker, is a freshman law student. He enrolled in Nebraska in the fall of 1907 and stayed here one semester. He then went to Kansas university for the second semester. He returned to Nebraska for a law course last fall. He
