**MOSELEY IS EDITOR**  
 WILL HEAD CORNHUSKER STAFF NEXT YEAR.  
**SUB-EDITOR NOT YET CHOSEN**  
 WHEELLOCK, SYFORD AND SCOTNEY WANT THE PLACE.  
 Junior Class Constitution Lost in Freshman Year, To Be Drafted by a Committee Appointed at Meeting Yesterday.

Ralph Moseley of Lincoln was yesterday morning elected editor-in-chief of the 1910 Cornhusker by the junior class. He received 105 votes on the first ballot, which count gave W. H. Potter of Omaha 26. The election of a managing editor was postponed until a later meeting after the first ballot taken showed a wide division of votes between three candidates. A committee was appointed with George M. Wallace as chairman to re-draft the class constitution, which was lost in the first year of the class' existence. Moseley was elected editor of next year's Nebraska annual under the rule that the junior class shall each year elect an editor-in-chief and a managing editor to serve at the head of the subsequent year's staff. Under this provision Moseley will take office next fall and the 1910 book will be compiled under his supervision.

**Good Attendance.**  
 There was a good attendance of Juniors in Memorial hall when President Yates called the meeting to order at 11:30. Nominating speeches were ruled out, the president himself making the nominations. These were Ralph Moseley, the present managing editor of the 1910 Cornhusker, and H. W. Potter. Remarks were then called for.  
 M. A. Mahood spoke briefly regarding the qualifications of Mr. Potter. He called attention to the fact that that gentleman had made no canvass for the office, his campaign having been instituted only on the day previous to the election and having been carried on entirely by friends who
