STUDENTS FIRST REQUEST ITS REMOVAL, THEN USE FORCE.

HELD UP ON THE CAMPUS UNDER COVER OF DARKNESS.

Was Coming Home From Prayer-Meeting But That Didn't Deter the Student Vandals Who Wantonly Desecrated His Whiskers.

Because Professor L. A.
