Another proposition which has been suggested is that the fraternities adopt rules similar to those now in force among the sororities. These would allow the pledging of any new student during the first week of the semester, with no initiations until the end of the semester, and then only in case the pledgee had a passing grade in all his work. This "one week" system is much favored in certain quarters, but it is said that it has rather poor chances of success in the council. It would seem to tend to a lowering of the standard, and this factor is a strong consideration among members of the inter-fraternity body. The sentiment is rather in favor of strengthening the restrictions than of relaxing
