### CHANGE MAJOR RULE

CHOICE MUST BE MADE AT THE END OF SECOND YEAR.

### MORE RIGID REQUIREMENTS

NEW SYSTEM OF ADVISORS IS OFFICIALLY APPROVED.

Recommendation That the Committee On Student Delinquency Have a Paid Secretary Passed on By the Faculty.

The faculty of the college of literature, science, and arts has adopted a revised system of registration and of faculty advisors for students which makes at least one important change in the plan at present followed. Hereafter students in the academic college must select their major subjects at the beginning of the second instead of the third year, as is the case at present.

This action was determined upon by the faculty of the college in approving a report offered by a committee consisting of Chancellor Avery, Deans Bessey and Davis, Professors Howard and Fosler, and the registrar. This committee considered various plans which were suggested and they presented the following report, which was passed:

#### Committee's Report.

1. The dean of the college shall be the chief adviser of the students in this college.
2. The dean shall be assisted by a board of permanent advisers composed of the heads of departments represented in this college and by a board of temporary advisers for freshmen composed of such persons as the heads of departments interested in freshmen work shall designate.
3. After September 1, 1909, all students in this college shall be required to select the major subject at the beginning of the second year. The head of the department in that subject shall be his permanent adviser.
4. During registration week, the dean of the college and the board of temporary advisers shall be present in Memorial hall for the registration of freshmen students. As the students present themselves they shall be sent in rotation to the advisers. The adviser shall examine the student concerning his preparation and his purpose in coming to the university; he shall help him in the arrangement of his course of study, indicating the required subjects and what additional subjects—if any are to be elected—will be most useful to him in the work that he has in view. The student shall take this form to the dean for his approval.

#### A Permanent Adviser.

5. The adviser to whom a freshman student is thus assigned at registration remains his adviser until the choice of a major subject or subjects is made. He shall give the students under his charge such assistance as may be necessary to make their work successful.
6. A committee of five shall be appointed through the senate committee on nominations to constitute a delinquent student committee with Professor Chatburn as chairman; and
7. The acting chancellor shall be requested to recommend to the board of regents the appointment of a paid secretary to this committee.
8. The senate course of study committee shall compile from all departments those subjects for which freshmen may register and such courses shall be published for registration purposes.
9. The term "unclassified student" shall hereafter be "adult special."
10. The dean of this college shall be the adviser for all "adult special" students registered in this college.
11. Professor Enberg and the registrar are appointed to work out a plan for the assignment to recitations and laboratories in the registration of students.
12. The registrar may determine

advisability of holding the spring registration.

Prominent Newspaper Man Believes in School of Journalism.

Leroy J. Boughner, city editor of the Minneapolis Tribune, recently expressed the belief that the initiation of the new course in journalism at the University of Minnesota should not be placed in the hands of one actuated by any desire of financial reward and he backed up his belief by volunteering to President Northrop, to deliver lectures for two years without cost to the university.
