**SCHEDULE FOR JACK'S TRIP NOW COMPLETE**

WILL LEAVE LINCOLN JUNE 14 FOR LIVERPOOL.

**SUBSCRIPTION HAS REACHED \$385**

Actual Expense for Trip Will Be \$200—Rest Will Be Turned Over for Use During Six Weeks' Stay in London.

The entire schedule for the Nebraskan's trip for Jack Best has been completed. Jack will leave Lincoln Tuesday, June 14, and will arrive at Liverpool the 24th. He will arrive in Lincoln again August 15. First class sleeping car berth accommodations have been secured both ways. The Empress of Ireland is the steamer going over and the St. Paul will bring him back. Dining accommodations have also been arranged. The total actual expenses will be \$200. The subscriptions have now reached a total of \$385.96. All this over the \$200 will be turned over to Jack to use during the six weeks he spends in London. Of the total subscribed, fraternities and sororities furnished \$150. Students furnished about three-fourths of the total amount and the alumni one-fourth.
