TO UNITE UNIVERSITY MEN OF ENGLAND AND AMERICA.  
LOCATED IN THE HEART OF CLUBLAND

Invitation to Join is Extended to Nebraska Men—May Be Found Advantageous Should They Travel Abroad.

The Daily Nebraskan is in receipt of an announcement of the opening of the American Universities Club of London, which occurs this week. The growing number of Americans in college in England on account of the Cecil Rhodes bequest, and the desire to form an alliance cementing relations of university men of the United States and Canada with those of the mother country is the end in view.

The club opens this month. The premises are those of the New Oxford and Cambridge Club, 68 Pall Mall, London, S. W. The club house immediately adjoins St. James's Palace and Marlborough House. Situated in the heart of "Clubland" it faces St. James street, Picadilly, close by the fashionable hotels and theaters. A large number of prominent men and nobility of England are among the honorary presidents and patrons.

American students are admitted to membership under the usual conditions imposed by clubs. In case any Nebraska student should go abroad he may avail himself of the opportunities of the club.
